Illinois at the East Central District Conf.

Officers of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Illinois participated in the East Central District Conference of the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International held at Merrillville, Indiana on Saturday March 10th, 2012. Representatives of the Grand Chapters of Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio, Michigan, Wisconsin and West Virginia meet annually to discuss the state of Capitular Masonry in their respective jurisdictions and to share information. The event was organized and hosted by our own Companion Bruce W. Rhinehart, Right Excellent District Deputy Grand High Priest for the East Central Division of the General Grand Chapter. Bruce is a Most Excellent Past Grand High Priest of Illinois and our current Grand Treasurer.

Companion Ted Harrison, Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the General Grand Chapter, was present and gave a great deal of inspiration and encouragement to the assembled state leaders of the constituent Grand Chapters. He talked about our need to focus on members under the age of forty, remarking "I try to spend a lot of time with our younger members, because they are the future of our organization." He encouraged our chapters to involve our Past High Priests in the mentorship of younger members, noting that they are a valuable resource that we should be tapping.

Companion Harrison also spoke enthusiastically about Royal Arch Research Assistance (RARA), the official charitable program of the General Grand Chapter. For many years RARA funds have been designated for the purpose of research into the cause and treatment of Central Auditory Processing Disorder (CAPD). A few years ago the institution RARA funds were committed to was unable to continue with its mission. The General Grand Chapter then worked with its investment advisors from Wells Fargo and identified three organizations whose missions included research into CAPD including The University of Connecticut, the Hearing Health Foundation and Autism Speaks. Last year RARA donated \$100,000.00 to each of these organizations to assist them in this important research work. The RARA is one three organizations which Companion Dale Cyrier, Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Illinois, has chosen to support this year through the Royal Arch Masons Charitable Foundation.

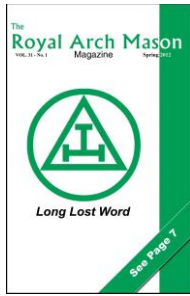
