## **GHP MESSAGE: LET THERE BE LIGHT**

Companions:

## LET THERE BE LIGHT, Part 2

In my July 2013 message, I talked about marketing the York Rite to our Blue Lodge brothers and challenged every Chapter to participate in at least one outreach event in the coming year.

The second issue we are facing is engaging all of our companions in a meaningful Masonic experience. We must not allow the routine business of "reading the minutes and paying the bills" to become the dominant experience of a Chapter meeting.

Degree work can always provide a meaningful experience, particularly for the participants. Many of our chapters can confer the Mark Master degree, and some can also confer the Past Master and Most Excellent Master degrees. If your chapter has not recently done degree work—or if the people who did the work for many years are no longer able, then

consider exemplifying a portion of the degree work as an educational experience. This exercise not only builds knowledge, but can build interest in reestablishing a degree team. Your Inspector will be eager to assist.

Remember the York Rite ritual is where we put to practice the Blue Lodge mandate to "study and obey the law which Thou hast given us in Thy Holy Word." Consider supplementing the ritual work with a bit of research, to locate the scripture on which it is based. The connection is certainly there, and it can provide some very interesting education, illumination, and context for any degree work.

Every Chapter can benefit from some level of Masonic education. A great deal of effort has also been expended in collecting Masonic education materials on the Grand York Rite web site.

We need to get these materials down to the working level to provide input and inspiration! Every High Priest should consider having a companion take the lead in organizing occasional education segments for a Chapter meeting. If the King is planning outreach work (see July 2013 article), maybe the Scribe could assist in the Masonic education planning? No special qualifications are required to contribute support Royal Arch education. Every companion should consider reading one of the web articles, in a lecture format. That is a great place to start.

At least once a year, consider inviting a guest speaker. If you don't have easy access to a renowned scholar—how about inviting a knowledgeable companion from another nearby chapter? It is surprising how a new face can stimulate interest.

Marketing efforts can bring new companions into the Chapter, but only a meaningful experience will keep them engaged and active. We must set a standard of excellence that will ensure the future of the York Rite tradition.

## SIMINOFF DAYLIGHT CHAPTER

## FIRST NEW CHAPTER SINCE 1984 SIMINOFF DAYLIGHT CHAPTER NO. 163 UNION CITY, CALIFORNIA

On Saturday, July 13, 2013, the first new Chapter in almost 30 years was constituted and installed – Siminoff Daylight Chapter No. 163. This Chapter meets at the Masonic Home of California in Union City, and uses the Lodge Room of Siminoff Daylight Lodge No. 850, F. & A. M. Immediately below is the new mural on the North side of the Lodge Room:



The Officers of the new Chapter are shown in the next picture, with Most Excellent Edgar W. Fentum as the new High Priest. M. E. C. Edgar served as Grand High Priest for California back in 2003-04, and is still laboring in the vineyards of freemasonry, having first established a new AMD Council at the Home, prior to establishing the new Chapter – aptly named, of course, as Siminoff Council No. 485:

Just below is a picture of the new High Priest, M. E. C. Edgar, along with M. E. C. Gary Spriggs, the current Grand High Priest for California, who also served as the Constituting and Installing Officer.



After the Ceremony of Constitution and Installation, over one-fourth of the Chapters around the State paraded in with their banners, led in many cases by the High Priest for the Chapter or a representative. Many of these Companions are also among the 57 Charter Members of the new Chapter! In the tux on the left is the current Grand Scribe, and holding the banner for Kern River Chapter No. 162, in the front right, is the Jr. Past Grand High priest of California, M. E. C. Robert V. Wright, Jr., who instituted the new Chapter during his term as Grand High Priest.



This brief report should give you an idea of how proud Royal Arch Masons around the State are of this new Chapter, and what it augurs for the future, in terms of Chapter and membership growth. It is no accident that these developments are occurring in Union City, where M. E. C. Edgar resides. Here is his biography, impressive for its accomplishments over the decades, but even more impressive for its recent accomplishments as he approaches his 80<sup>th</sup> birthday in August of 2014.

M. E. Comp. Edgar William Fentum received the degrees of Craft Masonry on the Isle of Wight, England. He was initiated an Entered Apprentice on December 13<sup>th</sup> 1974, passed to the degree of Fellowcraft on January 10<sup>th</sup> 1975 and raised to the degree of Master Mason on February 14<sup>th</sup> 1975. He served as a Steward in a progressive line of ten appointed Stewards and took ten years to reach Tyler in 1985 of Chine Lodge No 1884, English Constitution. He was exalted in 1975 as a Royal Arch Mason in Vectensian Chapter No 7852 on the Isle of Wight.

He was advanced to the degree of Mark Master Mason on 28<sup>th</sup> April 1977 and served as Worshipful Master of Medina Mark Lodge No 140 on the Isle of Wight in 1985. He holds the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons Provincial Grand Rank and is an Honorary Most Worshipful Past Grand Master.

He was a member of the Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priest, Royal Ark Mariners, Order of the Secret Monitor and many other Orders and degrees.

He and his wife Molly moved to California in 1986. He joined Los Altos Lodge in 1988 as Senior Deacon and served as Master in 1991. He was appointed as a Grand Lodge Inspector and served from 1993 to 2000.

He was High Priest of Palo Alto Chapter in 1993. He was appointed a Royal Arch Inspector and served from 1994 to 1998. In 1998 he was Chairman of the Grand York Rite Sessions at Fremont and appointed Grand Royal Arch Captain in the Grand Chapter of California.

In 1994 he was Commander of Palo Alto Commandery No 47 and Charter Sovereign Master of Britannia Council No 303, Allied Masonic Degrees in the same year.

He was received into the Royal Order of Scotland in 1994. He was a Charter member Grade IV<sup>o</sup> of California College S. R. I. C. F. in Los Angeles in 1994 and served as Celebrant VII<sup>o</sup> of the College in 1999. He was Charter Celebrant of Golden State College S.R.I.C.F. Los Altos in 2000 and elevated to Grade VIII<sup>o</sup> in 2004. He served as Recorder of Golden State College S.R.I.C.F. from 2004 to 2010.

He was Illustrious Master of Palo Alto Cryptic Council No 51 in 1995 and at the same time was Charter Secretary of Clanna Ruid Ruide No 58 Knight Mason of America. He served as Excellent Chief of Knight Masons in 1999.

He was Installed as the 149<sup>th</sup> Grand High Priest of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of California in 2003. He was the Charter High Priest of Golden State Chapter of Research in the same year.

He received the Knight York Cross of Honour in 1997 and Knight York Grand Cross of Honour in 2003.

In the Red Cross of Constantine he was 'installed' as a Knight Companion in 1977 on the Isle of Wight and was due to become Sovereign in 1987.

Having moved to California in 1986 he was invited to join Saint Francis Conclave in 1987. He served as Director of Ceremonies for 25 years and was Puissant Sovereign in 2002.

He is the Grand Representative to the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of England and to the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of England. He is also the Grand Chapter representative to New South Wales, Australia.

In the Scottish Rite he served as Venerable Master of the Lodge of Perfection, Wise Master of the Chapter Rose Croix, Commander of the Council of Kadosh and Master of the Consistory. After receiving the Knight Commander Cross of Honour in 2001 he was coroneted Inspectors General (Honorary) 33<sup>rd</sup> Degree.

He has written many Research Papers on esoteric aspects of Freemasonry and been Speaker at many Masonic events.

He is married to Molly and they have been residents in the Masonic Home since September 2007. They have four children and four grandchildren living in Texas, Florida and England.

## **LOCAL CHAPTERS ASSIST EACH OTHER**

Doric Chapter wanted to complete its program of individual degree conferrals in-house on five brothers, who needed only the Royal Arch degree to become Royal Arch Masons. They had received the MM, PM, and MEM degrees at Doric, starting in February 2013. But Doric had not yet formed a RA degree team.

Siminoff Daylight Chapter had just been formally chartered at their Constitution on July 13, the first new Royal Arch Chapter in California in 22 years. Conferral of the RA degree at Siminoff would initiate the new Chapter as truly viable and functioning.

Palo Alto Chapter had conferred the RA degree on numerous occasions over the years, and would welcome the opportunity to refresh their skills, by again conferring the degree locally. Most of their conferrals had been at larger Pilgrimages, but an opportunity to confer at a more personal venue would be refreshing.

Oakland Chapter had just conferred the MEM degree at Oakland on two brothers, and wanted them to receive the RA degree on a more personal level. Doric had previously helped Oakland by conferring the MM and PM degrees on these brothers. Oakland searched for a way to complete the degree conferrals.

In the spirit of true cooperation between these four local Bay Area Chapters, five brothers became new Royal Arch Masons, on July 27. Two of the beginning Doric brothers were not able to attend the RA conferral at Siminoff, and their journey will be completed later. Because they have all received individual care and attention along their journey, we expect they will want to become active members of both Doric and Oakland Chapters.

The new Doric and Oakland companions appear to be inspired, and we will immediately put them to work in whatever they want to do. They have enormous value to us for our future. They understand just how we feel about them, because we have demonstrated that in all our efforts.

Doric Chapter and Oakland Chapter will continue our individual degree conferrals in-house, with the active support of our new companions. Necessary improvements will be made to keep us at the top of Masonic bodies "living" the creed of Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth.


